Our Woodland Worship on Tuesday 18th April 2023, was all about Psalm 139. We found out that the book of Psalms in the Bible is a collection of songs and poetry written by people praising God, but also describing the trouble in their lives and asking for his help. Psalm 139 is a psalm of wonder and amazement about how God made us and knows each one of us incredibly well.



Psalm 139 tells us that God put us together, a bit like a piece of craft we might make in the classroom, or like a piece of sewing or knitting that our parents might make. He formed each of us with special care.

"You put me together inside my mother's body. How you made me is amazing and wonderful."



For our activity, we also put something together with special care. Our challenge was to make some Wild Weaving, using whatever we could find in the woods and Paddy's Patch. We scavenged a 'V'-shaped stick loom, wrapped wool around the prongs, and then went off to search for treasures to weave together.

When we compared our works of art, we could see that even though we had all chosen our grasses, flowers, feathers and twigs from the same area, all our weavings were a little bit different. No-one's weavings were the same – just like none of *us* are the same. God made us all UNIQUE.

We also thought about how our lives are a bit like our weavings – lots of different things have happened to us that have been woven together to make us how we are now. And however we are, God loves us, just like our school vision reminds us:

For you are all the children of God by faith in Jesus Christ - Galatians 3:26
